

Brenda Scheuermann, PhD

Brenda Scheuermann is a professor at Texas State University and a nationally known presenter and advocate for students with behavioral disorders. She is the lead author of Positive Behavioral Supports for the Classroom, 2nd ed. (Merrill, 2012) and Autism: Teaching Does Make a Difference (Wadsworth Press, 2002), and co-author of Educating Students with Autism: The Quick-Start Manual (Pro-Ed, 2008). She has also authored numerous journal articles in the area of behavioral interventions and behavioral disorders. A special education classroom teacher and behavior specialist for 8 years prior to joining the faculty at Texas State University in 1988, she is a behavior consultant and trainer for school districts and other agencies in Texas and across the country. Who should attend?

Week 1: Teachers, Paraprofessionals, School Counselors, School Psychologists, Educational Diagnosticians, Program Administrators, Instructional supervisors, Special Education Directors/Coordinators, Behavior Specialists/Consultants, and other professionals who work with students who exhibit emotional/behavior problems.

Week 2: All participants who have previously attended Week 1; those professionals who have had extensive training and/or experience working with students who exhibit challenging behavior; individuals who have a mastery of basic principles and procedures of positive behavioral supports and applied behavior analysis.

Workshop Location

All summer workshops will be held at “The Meeting Place” in San Marcos. The address of “The Meeting Place” is 400 C.M. Allen Parkway. The phone number is: 512-754-6802. You can park in the lot or along C.M. Allen Parkway. There is no parking fee.

Traveling south on IH 35: Take the C.M. Allen Parkway exit (exit# 204B). Remain on the access road to C.M. Allen Parkway. Turn right on C.M. Allen (baseball fields are on your right). Go 2 blocks. “The Meeting Place” is on the corner on the left.

Traveling north on IH 35: Take the Luling/Lockhart exit (exit#205). Stay in the left lane. Take the turnaround heading back south on the access road. Remain on access road to C.M. Allen Parkway. Turn right on C.M. Allen (baseball fields are on your right). Go 2 blocks. “The Meeting Place” is on the left.
